Residences

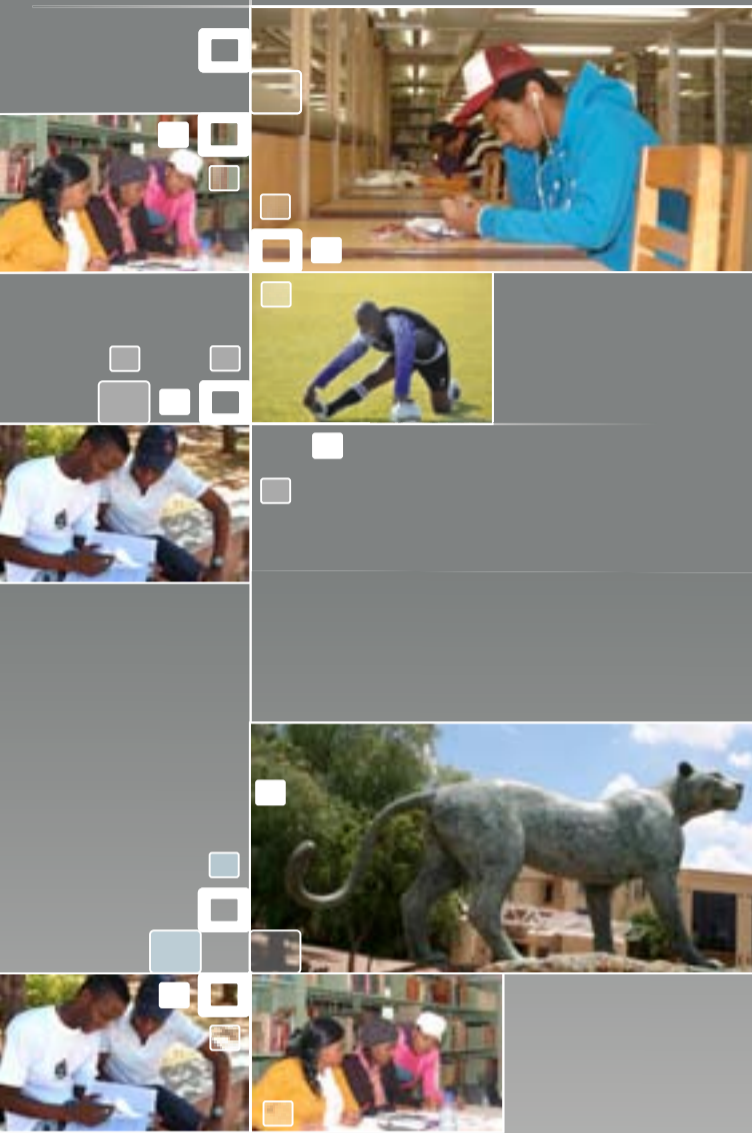

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR UNDER-GRADUATE STUDIES MAFIKENG CAMPUS

This document outlines the admission requirements for students who wish to study at the Mafikeng Campus of North-West University. This document must be read in conjunction with and subject to the General Academic and Faculty-specific Rules of the University. The University reserves the right to select from amongst candidates who comply with these minimum admission requirements.

1 GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1.1 ADMISSION ON THE BASIS OF THE NATIONAL SENIOR CERTIFICATE (AFTER 2008)

The statutory minimum requirements for degree and diploma studies are as follows:-

1.1.1 NATIONAL SENIOR CERTIFICATE

An achievement rating of 3 (40-49%) in three subjects (one of which is an official language at Home Language level) and a rating of 2 (30-39%) in three other subjects provided that a portfolio of evidence in the school-based assessment (CASS) component is submitted in the (seventh) subject failed.

1.1.2 DIPLOMA

A National Senior Certificate (NSC) with a minimum of 30% in the language of teaching and learning of the higher education institution as certified by Umalusi, coupled with an achievement rating of 3 (40% - 49%) in four (4) recognized NSC 20-credit subjects.

1.1.3 BACHELOR DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

A National Senior Certificate certified by Umalusi with at least an achievement of a rating of 4 (50-59%) in four (4) designated 20-credit subjects that are on the list of designated subjects, which are:-

1.1.4 COMPULSORY SUBJECTS

- Two official languages (An achievement of a rating of 4 in the language of education at Home Language or First Additional Language level).
- Mathematics or Mathematical Literacy
- Life Orientation (not taken into account for APS purposes and is not a designated subject)

1.2 ADMISSION OF STUDENTS WITH SENIOR CERTIFICATE (BEFORE 2008)

The minimum requirements are as follows:-

Diploma: senior certificate or any other qualification recognized by the University Senate as equivalent.

Degree: senior certificate with matriculation exemption (endorsement) (EXCEPT for Extended Programmes).

Students who do not have matriculation exemption (endorsement) may apply directly to Higher Education South Africa (HESA) to apply for conditional or full exemption.

Students are selected based on the calculation of an M-Score based on four Senior Certificate subjects as follows:-

1.3 ADMISSION OF STUDENTS WITH NON-NSC SCHOOL LEAVING CERTIFICATES

2. UNIVERSITY ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Additional admission requirements are also set by the university and these include the Admission Points Score (APS) as stipulated by the different faculties and faculty specific requirements.

2.1 ADMISSION POINTS SCORE (APS)

The results obtained in six NSC subjects are used to calculate the APS score. The results obtained in Life Orientation will not be used in the calculation of the APS score. The APS is scored as follows:-
